It 's Not Winter Kill, It 's Winter Slaughter!

Record low temperatures, prolonged low temperatures, early warming, followed again by record low temperatures have left golf courses from the Carolinas to Texas with the worst looking fairways in twenty years. We spent the last two weeks observing conditions and teaming up with University personnel to come up with the best strategy for recovery. Not each course was the same, but the damage is following certain patterns.

DESICCATION: Areas that are on slopes or in wind patterns show severe damage. This was due to the winds drying out the soil, followed by below freezing temperatures. The result was similar to freeze drying or desiccating the plant material. We observed that low spots in these areas showed much less damage than the high areas, even though the soil complex was the same. The difference was soil moisture. This condition was also observed in areas around bunkers. Golfers continuously spraying sand out of the bunker resulted in the turf growing in a sand medium. This gave no insulation and held very little water. The result was the same but for a slightly different reason.

SHADE: As we all know, Bernuda and shade do not mix. However, shady fairways that went into the fall looking very healthy, emerged from this winter with 50 percent to 75 percent damage on many courses. It is very common on fairways running north to south, to have a dead area extending from the eastern edge to the middle of the fairway. You can trace a jagged leading edge that corresponds with the tree line. To correspond with this, tees and rough areas that were in any shade patternare also showing winterkill.

WEAR AREAS: As would be expected, any areas that were stressed due to traffic are also showing severe winter kill. Courses that had a lot of fairway cart traffic are showing more damage than those that did not, providing other conditions were similar. On one course, the driving range had the most winter kill. This was a puzzle until someone figured out that the ball picker was continuously compacting the turf. There were several examples of tire patterns showing the most damage.

We also observed some surprising, if not strange, conditions. Two courses had fairways that were partially flooded during the most severe cold spell. These areas survived with little damage: no wear, no desiccation

MANAGE TO THE PARTY OF THE PART

and no shade. Most areas that had been trenched for irrigation lines had good coverage over the lines. One course found this to be true on all fairways but one, that fairway had green all around the lines, but the areas over the lines were deed. Now, that's a real puzzlel

MOWING HEIGHT: There is a definite correlation between mowing height and winter damage. One course had a lete tournament and kept the fairways cut at 1/2 inch. The fairways suffered a far greater amount of winter damage than did the roughs. Courses that were able to let the fairways get up to one inch seemed to fair better than those that did not.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Dr. Euel Coats, Mississippi State University, gave some advice we all need when he said, "Be patient, the rhizomes may be down in the soil an inch or more. Our soil temperatures have not been high enough to stimulate much activity, there may be more life than you think."

Dr. Gil Landry, University of Georgia, visited courses with Gold Kist representative Dick Crump. It was very evident that all courses were going to have to reestablish turf in many areas. Dr. Landry recommends, "Superintendents will have to maintain moisture and fertilize with a complete fertilizer using a 1 - 1 or 1 - 1/2 ratio of nitrogen to phosphorus. As long as they are sure there is no danger of another frost, sweep up as much debris as possible. This will aid in soil warm up. Minimize top dressing, verticutting, or any activity that will cause stress. Higher levels of soluble nitrogen will aid in a quicker grow in also." In addition, Dr. Landry suggested that superintendents map out damaged areas now so that they can plan a strategy for those areas next fall.

Informing your strategy, you may want to look at some work done by Mike Goatley, Mississippi State University, on fall fertilization. His work with late fall nitrogen applications showed improved spring green up and less winter stress. In addition, some work done at the University of Maryland indicated that applications of ammonium sulfate after September 1 decreased spring dead spot.

Any time conditions beyond control hit our industry, there are always those greens committees that want to assign blame to the superintendent. Observations show that no one has escaped this damage and no normal maintenance program was at fault. If you find yourself being questioned, we recommend getting your supervisor in the car and viewing the courses around you. It was not winter kill... it was winter slaughter
