

Body alignment is important in creating a consistant swing plane. You must get your body square to your target line. If you set up in a closed or open position, you will have an inconsistant swing plane.

A closed stance will cause an over the top swing plane.

To help with this problem, lay two clubs on the ground like railroad tracks. Insure they are parallel to your target to get the feeling of being square. The right club is your target line and the left is your body alignment.

Remember to keep your body angle the same throughout the swing; if the body angle changes, so does the swing plane.

#### **Course Update**

Many of you have noticed how wet the course is. There is a reason. We are in the process of overseeding the course and this moisture is needed to help the grass seed germinate. With that in mind, please try to avoid areas that get extremely wet. Cart traffic takes away from the appearance and quality of overseeding. Try to stay off the turf and the stripes will look better longer. Use the 90 degree rule and park cart in rough, not fairway.

As per your request, we have lowered the rough 1/4 inch to try to make it easier to play from. We are always listening to your request and will try to fill them whenever possible.

Again, we ask for your help in repairing ball marks on the green, sanding divots, and replacing rakes in the bunkers, after raking them.
