

CCGA Board Meeting
January 3, 2000

The meeting was called to order on Monday, January 3 at 6:30pm by our President, Burt Wronsky.

Burt welcomed everyone in attendance. 13 members were present.

Secretary's Report

Kathy Cornforth read the minutes from the November meeting. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Keith Sizemore and Wayne Jones seconded. In addition, Kathy read the minutes of our December meeting and election. Don Lemon moved to accept the reading of the minutes and Mike Cornforth seconded the motion. The minutes of both meetings were approved as read.

Burt thanked Kathy and Keith Sizemore for their past efforts as Secretary and Treasurer during 1999.

Treasurer's Report

Keith Sizemore presented the Treasurer's Report.

Keith also reported that we now have 55 members of the CCGA and submitted an updated roster. A motion to accept the Treasurer's report was made by Kathy Cornforth and seconded by Don Lemon. The motion was approved. A discussion following the Treasurer's Report was held regarding the current size of our membership. Keith informed us that our membership typically grows once we have our first tournament. Our current number is pretty much in line with where we were last year.

Staff Report—Lance Bailey

Lance thanked past officers for all their good and hard work and welcomed the new officers for 2000.

The upcoming Par 3 golf tournament was explained regarding format, rules, etc.

Lance reported that the Hole in One Jug was up to \$1,725. Also, he clarified that two witnesses would be required for a hole in one.

New steps to prevent slow play were explained. Effective January 1 a flag system is being implemented and will be used by the rangers to let golfers know whether they are keeping an acceptable pace of play. Literature is being prepared for golfers which will further explain the process. Burt encouraged Lance to discuss with rangers using discretion in implementing this new system.

Also, the yellow no cart signs are being moved closer to the greens to help speed up play.

A new Wednesday morning members league is attempting to form. Roger Fairchild and Bill Mitchell are leading this effort. An "official black book" is now being used for all league play such as this and the seniors.

Lance was asked for and gave an explanation of how the club is handling tee times when we have frost delays. He explained that the "flip flop" method is being used in order to accommodate the most people possible.

Bill Brown voiced his displeasure with the condition around the swampy area on Hole No. 3 and the need for beautification. Lance agreed that some improvement was needed. Money and EPA requirements make it unlikely any major will be done. However, Randy and crew will be clearing away as much vegetation as possible this year to make this area look better.

No. 4 green was discussed. It is better but remains a problem because of underlying sludge in the soil.

Old Business

George Patterson reported on his findings regarding the subject of what to do with excess funds that have been in our Treasury for some time now. George had discussion with numerous members of our organization on this subject. His findings revealed no lack of diverse ideas about how to spend this money. These ideas ranged from using the money to reduce members fees in golf tournament to beautifying the golf course. One idea was to use at least some of this money to encourage young disadvantaged youths to learn how to play golf. Andy Hendrix shared with us information about an organization that he and others give their time toward. It is called Masters City Golf and it is for all disadvantaged area youths starting at about the age of 10 and up. They have a fund raising golf tournament during the summer and ask for sponsor to donate. This idea was discussed by the group at length. Further consideration of this and other ideas was deferred to a future meeting.

Doug McLane moved that we donate \$100 to the favorite charity of any future deceased member rather than continuing to plant trees, put up plaques, etc. The motion was seconded by Andy Hendrix and approved by the members in attendance.

A discussion was held regarding the disbursement of money raised through selling mulligans at golf tournaments that we sponsor. A motion was made by Doug McLane that we put 75% of the money raised by selling mulligans back into prize money. Jack Stillwaggon seconded this motion and it was passed by the group.

Beautification of the course was discussed. This discussion revolved around what can we as the CCGA do and what should the owners of the golf course do. Lance stated that he would support the club sharing the expense of beautification as long as it is kept reasonable. He noted that the club has planted shrubs behind the back of No. 4 green this month.

New Business

Bert mentioned that he had been approached by a member with the suggestion that we cap the Hole In One prize money at \$1,000 and any excess be rolled over to the next hole in one. A discussion ensued on this subject. During the discussion it was decided that the CCGA does not have any authority over the rules for the hole in one prize money and therefore the discussion was terminated.

A motion was made by Joel Peecook and seconded by George Patterson that the old unclaimed money from the dog fight be put into the hole in one pot. The motion was approved.

Jack Stillwaggon moved to adjourn the meeting and this was seconded by George Patterson. The next meeting will be held on Monday, March 6, at 6:30 p.m.

CCGA BOARD MEETING

February 7, 2000

The meeting was called to order on Monday, February 7, at 6:30 p. m. Bert Wronsky welcomed everyone in attendance. 14 members were present.

Secretary's Report

John Andrews read the minutes from the January meeting. Kathy Cornforth moved to accept the minutes as read and Joel Peacock seconded. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

In Keith Sizemore's absence, Bert read the Treasurer's report.

Jack Stillwaggon moved that the Treasurer's report be accepted and George Patterson accepted. The motion was approved.

Staff Report

Lance Bailey presented the staff report. The next two tournaments at the club will be on February 26, a captain's choice. On March 3 we will have a night golf tournament. In addition Lance mentioned that the CSRA is having a tournament on February 28 at Midland Valley. Cedar Creek will be hosting a similar tournament in May.

A golf card will be for sale in the pro shop that will enable you to play 10 area courses at significantly discounted rates. The cost of the card is \$25.00. Each course allows you to play two times during the year at the discounted rates.

Lance recently attended a PGA show and exhibition. As a result, the pro shop will be featuring some new model Callaway equipment. Also, he noted that Callway has a new (and expensive) high tech ball they are introducing.

The new black tees will be introduced during February. The USGA rating for these tees will be 66.6 and the slope is 122. The scorecards will show these tees later this year after current supplies are exhausted. The computer will be modified shortly to allow one to enter scores for these tees.

A discussion ensued regarding how the black tees would work in various tournaments as well as the dog fights. No final decision was made however, there appeared to be general consensus that black tees should generally be used by high handicap and/or players over 65 if they prefer to use these tees. Bert Wronsky's recommendation for the dog fight was that anyone using the black tees in the dog fight should establish a new handicap from these tees and not be allowed to play from the white tees again until they reestablish a new handicap from the white tees. Handicap in this case meaning a dog fight handicap.

A suggestion was made to Lance that windshields be wiped off on a periodic basis.

A suggestion was made to Lance that No. 7 trap needs further maintenance since it continues not to drain properly and is requiring continual maintenance.

A discussion regarding yardage markers included comments by Jack Stillwaggon that he felt the markers for 150 yards was incorrect on No. 12 and Bert added that may also be the case on No. 13. Lance feels that sprinkler head markers are pretty accurate but that some 150 yard markers could be slightly off.

Tournament Director's Report

Mike Cornforth gave the report and reiterated the information on the nine hole night golf tournament on March 3.

Mike talked about the upcoming Memorial tournament. Last year we had the Houston and messura tournaments. This year we are considering having just one tournament to honor all disceased members. The suggestion was made by Burt to donate \$100 to the Houston Memorial and the remainder the cancer society from the net proceeds from this tournament. This tournament will be held most likely in April.

Tournament Director's Report—Mike Cornforth

Mike reported that our first CCGA tournament will be a two man best ball night golf tournament. This is tentatively scheduled for March 5.

Mike gave a report from the Ad Hoc Black Tee Committee comprised of himself, Lance and Joel Peacock. A new set of tees are being recommended that would be 5,800 yards long. The tees would be placed variously on either the front of the white tees or the back of the red tees. An exception to this may be No. 6, which may require a new tee. A course rating and index will be secured by Lance from the SCGA. This will take 1-2 months most likely. Mike explained how these tees would work during dog fights, tournaments, etc. Lance explained that the computer would be modified to show a handicap from the black tees. All of this work is going forward and will be implemented as quickly as possible.

Burt suggested to Mike that we should examine the possibility of doing one major memorial tournament to honor our deceased members. Mike agreed to look into this.

Old Business

A question was raised regarding what had we agreed to in the past regarding the awarding of golf hats to members who attend board meetings with no absences or few absences. Bert asked the secretary to check prior minutes to confirm what had been agreed to on this subject.

New Business

Keith Sizemore raised the issue of what, if anything, should we do with excess money we have in the treasury. After some discussion, Burt appointed George Patterson to form an ad hoc committee to bring back a recommendation to the group on this subject.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Wayne Jones and seconded by Don Lemon.

The next meeting will be held on Monday, February, 7 at 6:30 PM.

CCGA Board Meeting
March 6, 2000

The Meeting was called to order on Monday, March 6, at 6:30 p.m. Bert Wronsky welcomed everyone in attendance. 15 members were present.

Secretary's Report

John Andrews read the minutes from the February meeting. A clarification to the minutes was made regarding unclaimed dog fight money going into the hole in one pot. The money will go into the pot if unclaimed after six months. Jack Stillwaggon moved the minutes be accepted as clarified. Don Lemon seconded. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

In Keith Sizemore's absence, Don Lemon read the Treasurer's Report. There was no activity in the account during February. The balance in the account remains \$2,366.08. Ed Griffin moved the report be accepted. Doug McClain seconded. The report was approved.

Staff Report

Mike Hoffstetter presented the staff report. Mike announced that the Memorial Golf Tournament would be held on March 18, 2000. It will consist of a four man captain's choice picked by the computer. On Monday, March 20, the club will host a Member Appreciation Day. The Member Guest Tournament will be held on May 13 and 14. Mike encouraged us all to try and bring a guest to this tournament. The Club Championship is scheduled for August 26 and 27. The hope is that we can get more people participating and more diversity of groups that play. The Night Golf Tournament had about 20 players. Jerry and Pat Sullivan won low gross. J. D Wiggins and Steve Brown won low net.

Some 70 new golf carts arrived in early March. They are the same basic model cart and are equipped similarly to the previous carts. The club has been experiencing an abnormal number of flat tires on carts caused by golf tees. Mike encouraged everyone to pick up any tees they see on the course.

A Fish Dinner will be held on Friday, March 20.

Mike reviewed the new rules regarding walking, running, etc. on the cart paths. The back nine can be used up to 9 a.m. for this purpose and the front nine is ok during the last two hours before dark.

Joel Peacock thanked the staff for the good work that was done in finally getting the trap fully repaired on Number 7 hole and fixing the 150 yard markers.

Mike noted that the spike shoe survey that was recently done showed that only five golfers out of 237 were wearing spikes. This led the staff to believe that spikes were not a big problem on the course and they do not plan to change the spike policy at this time.

Other comments from various members concerned seeing jeans randomly being worn on the course in violation of club rules, some traps need some new sand, etc.

Bert ended this portion of the meeting with a request that the club

go all out to promote the Memorial Tournament this year since it is a charity event and normally raises a considerable amount of money.

Tournament Director's Report

Mike Cornforth presented his report and began by reviewing this year's Memorial Tournament. This year the tournament honors past members who have died since the club was opened. Specifically to be honored will be members Sparkes, Molony, Messura, Lovelace and Foulkes. Mike noted that at this year's tournament we would be selling unlimited mulligans to increase the prize money.

Future tournaments tentively planned include events on April 22, May 27 and a Red, White and Blue event on July 1.

Old Business

Further discussion took place regarding what did we agree to regarding qualifying for straw hats by attending a minimum number of meetings of the CSGA. No final resolution was made pending one final attempt to secure the minutes of the meeting from last year when this item was passed by the membership.

A long discussion took place regarding the rules governing black tees during dogfights. After considerable back and forth, Ed Griffin moved that during requalifying for black tee play, players would simply have three points added to their target. After a second to this motion and more discusion , the motion did not pass. Doug McClain then moved that to be eligible to play from the black tees a players must play three rounds from these tees to requalify for a target from these tees. During these requalifying rounds a player would only be eligible to win the closest to the pin prizes. The motion was further amended by Burt to limit black tee play in dogfights to players who are 65 or over and/or have a 22 or higher USGA handicap. This amended motion was seconded by Jack Stillwaggon and passed by a vote of the members present.

New Business

Kathy Cornforth brought up the problem of cigarette butts being thrown around the course, particularly on and around greens. Bert suggested that this item be mentioned in next months Sandbagger.

Don Lemon brought up the issue of many of the traps being left unraked by players. He made the suggestion that this item also be mentioned in the Sandbagger.

Jack Stillwaggon moved that the meeting be adjourned and this was seconded by Mike Cornforth. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15p.m. Our next meeting will be held on Monday, April 3, 2000.

CCGA BOARD MEETING

April 3, 2000

The meeting was called to order on Monday April 3, at 6:35pm. Bert Wronsky welcomed everyone in attendance. 11 members were present.

Secretary's Report

Don Lemon read the minutes of the March 6th meeting in the absence of John Andrews. Jack Stillwaggon moved that the minutes be accepted as read and Joel Peecook seconded the motion. The minutes were approved. Jerry Sullivan requested that those playing from the black tees please note it on the sign up sheet on the day of play.

Treasurer's Report

Keith Sizemore presented the treasurer's report noting that we had a beginning balance of \$2,366.08 on March 1 and an ending balance of 2,364.58 on April 1. A \$300.00 donation to the Cancer Society was made from the proceeds collected during the Memorial tournament. Money from the sale of mulligans in the Memorial Tournament went toward prizes. Eight new members were enrolled during the month. A motion to accept the report was made by Mike Cornforth and seconded by Jack Stillwaggon. The report was approved with no further discussion.

Staff Report

Mike Hoffstetter presented the staff report. Mike extended thanks to the CCGA for its cooperation during Master's week. He noted that while there is a significant increase in play during this week there were still tee times available. He felt that the course is in very good condition for this time of the year. There was general agreement with this statement among those in attendance. Mike noted that 70 new golf carts had arrived and that 10 additional carts were added during Master's week.

A discussion ensued regarding cigarette butts littering the course. The club would like smokers to dispose of cigarette butts in empty soda cans, etc. while playing. Signs are being prepared to

address this and some other issues and will be placed in carts and around the course.

There was a discussion regarding several issues including traps being left unraked, failure to repair ball marks and divots and wearing denim while playing the course. Mike stated that these issues have been addressed with the rangers and they attempt to get the cooperation of players to observe the rules and proper golf etiquette. The previously mentioned signs will also address some or all of these issues. Mike noted that players themselves when in a group can help matters by pointing out violations to other players in their group.

Don Lemon noted that he has observed several of the high school age players routinely violating some of the rules and asked Mike to notify the coaches and encourage them to incorporate proper golf etiquette as part of their teaching players about how to play the game. Mike agreed to do this and has already begun talking with some coaches.

Doug Snyder encouraged the club to put some new sand in many of the traps. Mike will take this issue to the next staff meeting. Their was agreement among members at the meeting that new sand is needed in many traps.

Pat Sullivan asked about the policy of young children riding and/or driving golf carts. She also noted that she has seen young children on the course, not playing golf, and being in danger of being hit by golfers who were playing. Mike stated that the policy of the club is to allow young children to ride with adult supervision but they are not allowed to drive a cart unless they have a valid SC drivers license

Lastly, Burt Wronsky asked Mike to see if the cart staff could do a better job of filling the sand bottles before putting the carts out for play. Mike agreed to take care of this issue.

In a final comment, Mike noted that there were two outside tournaments schduled for April—A Baptist Seniors tournament on April 24th and a Walmart tournament on April 27th.

Tournament Director's Report

Mike Cornforth presented his report by reviewing how successful the Memorial Tournament had been. He noted that no tournaments are scheduled for the month of April. There will be a tournament during May which will feature a different format for each

six holes of the round. Further details on this tournament and how it will work will be available soon. The Club Championship is scheduled for August 26 and 27th. A member/guest tournament is scheduled for October 28th and 29th.

Some discussion ensued about what could or should be done during the member/guest. The size of our present day club house precludes us from having a social event during this tournament such as a dinner dance which is traditionally a part of many clubs member/guest tournaments. We will continue to look at this tournament and see if changes are needed that can be done given our clubhouse.

Mike indicated that a Bubba tournament may be held during June. Finally, he indicated that he would welcome anyone who may want to help him in organizing and conducting this year's tournaments.

Old Business

After some discussion, a motion was made by Jack Stillwaggon and amended by Doug Snyder, as follows: Beginning July 1, 1999, any member attending six meetings during a rolling twelve month period will qualify for one Cedar Creek straw hat.. This motion was seconded by Mike Cornforth and the motion was passed.

New Business

There was no new business.

Jack Stillwaggon moved that the meeting be adjourned and this was seconded by Mike Cornforth. The meeting was adjourned at 8:00pm. Our next meeting will be held on Monday, May 1.

The meeting was called to order on Monday, May 1 at 6:30 pm. Bert Wronsky welcomed everyone in attendance. 12 members were present.

Secretary's Report

John Andrews read the minutes from the April meeting. Keith Sizemore moved that the minutes be accepted as read and Jack Stillwaggon seconded the motion. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Keith Sizemore presented the treasurer's report noting that we had a beginning balance of \$2,364.58 on April 1 and an ending balance of \$2,343.58 on May 1. A motion to accept the report was made by Bill Marks and seconded by George Patterson. The report was approved with no further discussion.

Prior to the staff report being given, Bert indicated that he would like the secretary to report back to him at the next meeting who would qualify for straw hats according to the motion that was passed on this subject at the prior meeting. Lance will then be given an order for an appropriate number of hats to be purchased.

Staff Report

Lance Bailey gave the staff report. A tournament will be held at the club on May 27th. It will feature a unique format using two person teams. Six holes will be best ball, six holes will be alternate ball and six holes will be a captain's choice. A varying percentage of handicap will be used with each format. There will be a low gross/low net winner for each six holes and overall.

Special dinners will be held during the month of May on the 13th and 25th.

Lance noted that several corporate tournaments will be held in May. Most will occur on Mondays or Fridays. On May 29th a members appreciation day will occur.

A number of comments came from the group following Lance's presentation. Several comments were made that tee markers need to be moved more often to avoid excessive wear on the tees. Also, a comment was made that yardage stripes on the cart paths need to be renewed. Jack Stillwaggon noted that on the 14th hole he thought that the no cart signs could be moved further forward. It was noted that during a recent corporate tournament a youth was seen driving a cart throughout the day. Don Lemon observed that he has seen people walking on the front nine during the morning hours in violation of the rules. Bert Wronsky noted that there has been several occasions when there were no cups for water coolers.

Lance responded that he noted all these comments and would look into each of them. In addition, he commented on the vandalism that

occurred several weeks ago. Over \$2,000 in damage occurred to the grounds , water coolers, etc. He indicated that insurance money will help to defer most of the damage and will be used to purchase new water coolers which will have locks.

In response to a question from John Andrews, Lance commented on the use of Cedar Creek by members of Woodside. As a matter of courtesy, Woodside members will be able to schedule tee times at Cedar Creek from June 15 to September 1 one week in advance. This is being done while repairs are taking place at Woodside and several area golf courses are cooperating in a similar manner. Bert asked Lance to announce this in the monthly newsletter and remind CC members that they may want to book their tee times earlier.

Tournaments Director's Report

Mike Cornforth was unable to attend due to an illness in the family.

Old Business

A lengthy discussion took place regarding traps, sand in traps, not raking traps, etc.

Don Lemon asked Lance if he could give us an update as to how the "War On Slow Play" was going. Lance indicated that he believed that the course was generally being played faster than at this time last year. He believed the dog fight was somewhat faster this year. He also indicated that he has been working with the rangers to develop more consistency in applying slow play rules. Lance indicated that the flag system may be misinterpreted by some players. He pointed out that it is only intended to let you know the pace of play and does not necessarily mean that the group you are playing with is causing the problem.

In summary, Lance says this program is a compromise in an attempt to make the golf course a better place to play.

In response to a question, Lance commented that the trip to Scotland is going forward and eight people will be making this trip. He is also looking into golf package trips that could be taken this fall.

In response to a question, Bert indicated that he has not received a proposal from Andy Hendrix yet regarding supporting the Master's City Golf Tournament to help raise money for disadvantaged youths to learn how to play golf.

In closing , Bert noted that the \$300.00 that we raised for the Cancer Society in a recent tournament will be donated to the "Run For Life" . Cedar Creek Golf Association will be noted as a contributor in the advertising for this fund raiser.

New Business

There was no new business.

Jack Stillwaggon moved to adjourn and George Patterson seconded. The meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m. Our next meeting will be held on Monday, June 5.

The meeting was called to order on Monday, June 5 at 6:30 pm. Burt Wronsky welcomed everyone in attendance. Nine members were present.

Secretary's Report

John Andrews read the minutes from the May meeting. Jack Stillwaggon moved that the minutes be accepted as read and Joel Peecook seconded the motion. The minutes were approved as read.

Treasurer's Report

In Keith Sizemore's absence, Don Lemon read the Treasurer's Report. We began the month of May with a balance of \$2,343 and ended the month with a balance of \$2,323. Doug McLain moved that the report be accepted as read and Jack Stillwaggon seconded. The motion was approved.

Staff Report

Rocky Oswald gave the staff report. He noted that Golf Digest recently notified the Club that it had received a 4 Star rating out of a possible 5 Stars. This is the same rating that we had previously and is obviously quite good.

The Junior Golf Clinics will be held again this summer during June and July. The cost is \$75 and is for children ages 10 to 16.

The Domestic Dispute golf tournament for couples will be held on June 23 and will be a nine hole event including dinner.

Houndslake Country Club is looking for caddies for a state women's golf tournament being held there during July 9-14.

During this summer, on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, number 10 tee will be open for use beginning at 8:00am. Number 1 tee will be open as usual at 7:00am. Groups will be allowed to start off both front and back.

The meeting was called to order on Monday, July 3, 2000 at 6:30 PM. Burt Wronsky welcomed everyone in attendance. 11 members were present.

Secretary's Report

John Andrews read the minutes of the June 5th meeting. Jack Stillwaggon moved that the minutes be accepted as read and Don Lemon seconded. The minutes were approved. A suggestion was made that the minutes be sent to Lance and Randy and that they be posted on the bulletin board. This was accepted and will be done beginning in July.

Treasurer's Report

CCGA BOARD MEETING

September 5, 2000

The meeting was called to order on Monday, September 5, 2000 at 6:30 p.m. Burt Wronsky, President, welcomed everyone in attendance. Six members were present.

Secretary's Report

John Andrews read the minutes of the August 7th meeting. Andy Hendrix moved that the minutes be approved as read and Doug Snyder seconded. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Keith Sizemore gave the report. The balance at the beginning of the month was \$2,341.33. Our balance at the end of the month was \$2,283.87. The most notable expenditure was \$286.46 for 18 CCGA straw hats. Doug Snyder moved that the report be approved. Andy Hendrix seconded the report and it was approved. John Andrews noted that we had four additional members now qualified for straw hats by their attendance during the past 12 months. They are: Bernie Mayansik, George Patterson, Doug Snyder and Otis Beard. John agreed to give Lance a memo stating this so these members can get their hats at their convenience.

Staff Report

Mike Hoffstetter presented the report. Beginning Monday September 5th small tines will be used on the greens. This process should take only two days and the greens should heal quickly.

Mike explained the upcoming Member-Guest tournament details. This will be held on October 28th and 29th. This could represent the largest golf/social activity yet held at the Club. A minimum of 30 two person teams will be necessary to make this event a reality. It was agreed that we need to get members to support this tournament.

Adam Powell has been added to the staff and will work three to four days per week in the Pro Shop.

A three person Breakfast Scramble is planned for Friday, September 29th, with a 9 a.m. shotgun start.

September 25th is Member Appreciation Day and green fees will be waived along with discounted items in the grill.

A discussion ensued regarding the black tees. Basically, there is a difference of opinion regarding how the computer handles black tee handicapping. Mike reviewed his understanding of how the computer deals with black tee handicapping. No agreement on this matter was reached.

Also, in response to comments raised by several members regarding handicaps, Burt believes CCGA should consider forming a handicap committee next year and will bring this matter to the attention of the members at our December Annual meeting.

In addition, it was noted that there have been complaints from some participants about some players improperly switching golf balls during tournaments and dog fights. 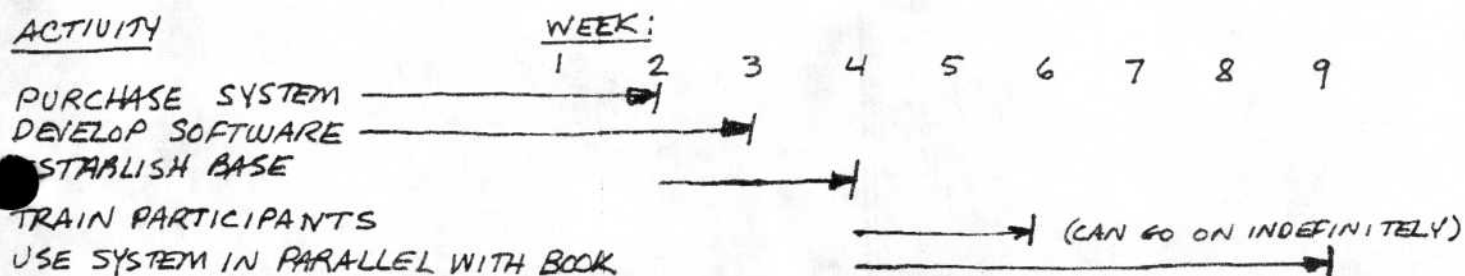
GOLF ASSOCIATION, GOLF COURSE AND OTHER SOURCES.

- DEVELOPMENT OF "SOFTWARE" (A SYSTEM) - VOLUNTEER LABOR IS AVAILABLE. IF THIS SOURCE IS DEEMED INAPPROPRIATE, OUTSIDE HELP COULD BE USED.
- SOMEONE MUST TURN ON THE COMPUTER SYSTEM - STAFF PERSONNEL SHOULD BE AVAILABLE.

- RELIABILITY OF THE COMPUTER AND COMPUTER SYSTEM. THE GOLF COURSE MUST PAY THE ELECTRIC BILL! TO TEST THE SYSTEM IT IS BELIEVED THAT IT SHOULD BE USED IN PARALLEL WITH THE "BOOK" FOR 4-5 WEEKS.
- SOMEONE MUST RETRIEVE MONEY AND MAKE PAYOUTS - THIS COULD BE A PROBLEM. GOLF ASSOCIATION PERSONNEL GOLF COURSE PERSONNEL AND VOLUNTEERS MAY BE REQUIRED
- THE CURRENT SYSTEM "BOOK" IS UNWIELDY, ERROR PRONE, SLOW AND DEPENDENT UPON VOLUNTEERS FOR IMPLEMENTATION - THE SIZE OF THE "DOGFIGHT" CONTINUES TO GROW. THIS GROWTH HAS CREATED CONDITIONS

WHICH MAKE IT DIFFICULT, AT BEST, TO DO A GOOD JOB WITH THE CURRENT SYSTEM. OUR VOLUNTEERS DO A NICE JOB UNDER THE PRESSURE BUT ERRORS CAN BE, AND ARE, MADE. THE PROBLEM IS FURTHER COMPLICATED BECAUSE OF THE DIFFERENT ATTITUDES OF THE VOLUNTEERS.

THERE ARE OTHER CONCERNS BUT IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE ABOVE ARE THOSE OF MAJOR CONSEQUENCE. I BELIEVE THAT A COMPUTER SYSTEM IS WARRANTED FOR OPERATING THE CCGA DOGFIGHTS AND SO RECOMMEND. THE COST TO IMPLEMENT SUCH A SYSTEM SHOULD BE LESS THAN \$1000.00 AND WHILE THIS IS A RATHER LARGE SUM OF MONEY IT CAN BE RAISED WITH LITTLE ONUS OR EFFORT. THE RESULT OF USING A COMPUTER SYSTEM IN PLACE OF THE CURRENT "BOOK" IS THAT WE WILL HAVE A PROFESSIONALLY DONE, QUICK AND RELATIVELY ERROR FREE SYSTEM REQUIRING VERY LITTLE PERSONAL INVOLVEMENT.
