#### CEDAR CREEK GOLF ASSOCIATON MONTHLY MEETING

#### JANUARY 17, 2005

President Ron Phillips called the meeting or order at 6:30 pm, welcomed everyone and acknowledged new member, Bill Collins. Ron introduced the 2005 CCGA Board.

**<u>1. MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING</u>**: The Secretary read the minutes of December 4, 2004. The minutes were approved as read. The audience was reminded that the minutes are posted each month on the bulletin board in the Members' Lounge.

**2.a PRESIDENT'S REMARKS:** Ron thanked everyone who had volunteered to serve on the various committees last year. He stated more people were involved on committees in 2004 than any time previously and hoped more members would become involved in 2005. Ron will be putting together a list of 2004 accomplishments in the near future. He did remark that the most progress in 2004 was the Handicap's Committee education of members to post their scores and improved communication to CCGA members though e-mail and the inserts in the *Sandbagger*.

**2.b** Ron announced that the 2005 focus will be on handicaps and; increasing members attendance at meetings, CCGA tournaments and the Dog Fight Tournaments. Ron, "The Rule Man" will continue his educational programs. Ron is putting together a committee to look at a different way to honor deceased members other than planting trees. He is also putting together a committee to look at medical emergency responses between the club house and on the course and will need volunteers for these committees.

**<u>2.c.</u>** Ron reminded members of the "ground rules" to be followed at a regular meeting. He requests that members raise their hand to be recognized, state their name, speak clearly and not interrupt other speakers.

**<u>3. TREASURER'S REPORT</u>**: Earl Bennett reported that the bank had agreed not to charge a service charge to the CCGA Account until June 30. By then, the minimum balance required in order not to have a service charge should be in the account. The treasury balance as of December 31, 2004 was \$1,383.46. The current balance as of January 17 is \$1,427.81. A copy of the report will be placed with the minutes and posted on the bulletin board in the Members' Lounge. Earl has been appointed to Chair the 2005 Finance Committee.

**4. TOURNAMENT CHAIR REPORT:** Co-Chair, Phil Stack, reported 57 players participated in the 4-Club Tournament on January 15. Phil announced that the next tournament will be held February 19 and will be a 2 person team, alternate shot format. He passed out cards with the 2005 tournament dates listed. The audience was reminded that the sale of mulligans help pay for the prizes awarded at each tournament.

5. HANDICAP COMMITTEE: Mimi Wittkamp stated that the last review of scores

posted was the December Dog Fight. The review showed 98% compliance. President Phillips stated that the Handicap Committee for 2005 will be more aggressive in compliance and the Committee will be expanded. Ward Welch will be Chairman of the Handicap Committee. Other members are: Bob Levitt, Greg Pasco, Paul Pecoraro, Mike Hoffstatter, Gene Reardon and Pat Sullivan. Ron will be requesting that the Pro Shop and/or Committee post the scores.

**6.a MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE:** Dan Mulvey reported that the Committee will try to get more members to attend meetings. He has been looking for different enticements such as speakers or activities and has asked members for ideas. There is an information packet available for new members in the Pro Shop and Dan will submit CCGA information for publication in the Community Newsletter. He is looking at a possible solicitation by mail to non-member property owners as associate members who would receive e-mails and information regarding tournaments, etc.

**<u>6.b.</u>** Dan introduced Rex Decker, registered club maker, as guest speaker. Rex defined "Bounce" or "Soling" and spoke of the difference in bounce in wedges. Rex also answered questions from the audience.

**7.a. PRO SHOP REPORT:** Mike Hoffstatter reported that winter maintenance consisted of pruning, taking out trees to improve the growth of grass and pruning limbs from the ice storms. He announced that the back nine would be closed January 17 & 18 and the front nine January 19 &  $20^{\text{th}}$  in order to do weed control. Two days are needed to make sure the weed killer is dry in order not to track it into good areas. Results should be seen in approximately three weeks.

**7.b.** Mike reminded members to sign up for the February 5 "Beat the Boss" Tournament. He also reminded the audience to repair ball marks and fill in divots. Mike stated that he had been asked about the rating of the black tees. Those tees were rated when they were put out. The new Black Tee and Red Tee on #6 will be re-rated when completed.

7.c. Mike answered questions from the audience including:

- 1. Paul Pecoraro asked if divots should be replaced or filled with sand. Mike responded that it is best to use sand but sand plus the divot could be used.
- 2. Jim Mitchell inquired if there were any plans to level the greens. Mike stated that top dressing the greens levels them and it will be done in the Spring.
- 3. Bob Armstrong asked about players not in the Dog Fight being put in between the groups. Mike stated that this should be done only if there is a two hole gap

or possibly when there has been a frost delay.

**8.a. OLD BUSINESS:** Ron stated the four new Cherry Trees have been purchased. The \$100 donation to Silver Bluff High School Golf Team that the 2004 Finance Committee had included in the 2004 Budget was forwarded and a "Thank You" note has been received from the Golf Team Coach.

**<u>8.b.</u>** Paul Pecoraro has volunteered to get a Match Play League started. Paul may need help. Let him know if you are interested or have ideas regarding conducting the Match Play.

**<u>8.c.</u>** Luanne Langmo asked if there had been any feedback from members regarding the low attendance at the Club Championship Tournament. Ron responded that he had received some input and will get together with the Board and Mike in the future.

**<u>8.d.</u>** Ron also stated that he is working on Inter-Club Play and requested members to volunteer to help.

**9.a. NEW BUSINESS:** Ron then reported that Art Kennedy asked if CCGA wished to contribute money towards the construction of the Black Tee on Hole #6 (this had been under consideration by CCGA in 2004; but was deferred). The construction would take place in March and April and would need to be finished by June. The estimate provided to CCGA was \$5,690 to construct the new tee. Mike Hoffstatter stated that the Tee Box would be 5400 square feet and includes the Red Tee Box renovation. Materials would cost approximately \$1700 plus \$1,170 for growth costs and additional time costs added to the labor force. Ron asked for discussion from the audience as to whether or not CCGA should contribute money towards this project.

Some of the comments were: The project should be the owner's responsibility; the donations should be a bare minimum of 50 Cents on the dollar and to look at the capital, not the maintenance and growing; the Finance Committee should look at the budget and come back with a recommendation. Ron explained that CCGA has always put some money into improving the course especially for items that members have complained about. Ron stated the he thought \$500 would be appropriate.

**<u>9.b.</u>** Gene Kolkman made a motion to allocate \$500 to help put in the Black Tee Box on Hole #6. The money would be made available when the Tee Box was completed. The motion was seconded and carried. (20 Yes, 5 No)

**9.c.** Paul Pecoraro stated that he thought the amount was inadequate and should be twice the amount. (\$1,000). Paul made a motion to double the amount of the donation for

construction of the Black Tee Box on #6 to \$1,000. The motion was seconded and defeated. Ron stated that the donation could be revisited at a later time.

**9.d.** Ron reminded the members that half of the Mulligan Money received at the CCGA Tournaments goes toward prize money for that tournament. The other half goes into the CCGA Treasury to pay for everything else except administrative costs which are paid for by the members' dues. If we have free tournaments, the Mulligans pay for them. Ron requested input from the members as to whether or not there should be criteria for members to play for free in the "free" tournament. (e.g. A member would have to have bought 6 Mulligans during the year).

**<u>9.e.</u>** After discussion from the audience, Jack Bahen made a motion to raise the tournament fee by \$10.00,  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the \$10.00 to go to the present tournament for prize money,  $\frac{1}{2}$  to the CCGA Treasury. Every participant to get 2 Mulligans automatically. The motion was seconded and passed.

**<u>9.f.</u>** John Andrews made a motion that if there is a free tournament a participant must have played in 3 tournaments during the year in order to play "free". The motion was seconded and passed.

**9.g.** Ron stated that he had reviewed comments from CCGA members. Most comments pertained to meals; members felt that there should be an option of signing up for the meal. After some discussion, Ron decided to try making food an option at the tournaments and will write a letter to the club to justify the decision.

**<u>9.h.</u>** Gene Reardon brought up getting a first response, equipment, etc. to emergency situations on the course. Ron stated that he is putting together a committee to address the issue as to what is realistic. Gene volunteered to be on the committee.

**10.** Jim Mitchell suggested that since the Minutes and the Finance Report are posted on the Bulletin Board that we not take the time to read them at our monthly meetings. President Ron will determine whether it is appropriate to do that.

11. The next meeting will be Monday, February 21.

12. The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 pm.

#### CEDAR CREEK GOLF ASSOCIATION MONTHLY MEETING

#### FEBRUARY 21, 2005

President Ron Phillips called the meeting to order at 6:31 pm, welcomed everyone and acknowledged new members Stan Gardzina and Craig and Joanne Ellis. Ron also recognized Past Tournament Chair, George Kowalczyk. Ron reminded the members to sign in and give their e-mail address on the sheets provided.

**1. MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING:** President Ron announced that he had checked in the *Roberts' Rule Book* and decided since the minutes are sent out by e-mail and posted in the Members' Lounge that in the future, the Secretary will not read the Minutes. Ron asked if there were any corrections to the January 17, 2005 Minutes as written and posted. There being no corrections, the minutes were approved as written.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT: There was no Treasurer's Report as the Treasurer was out of town.

**<u>3. TOURNAMENT CHAIR REPORT</u>**: Co-Chair, Bill Robinson, reported 72 players participated in the Alternate Shot Tournament on February 19 with 42% of the participants receiving money. The Co-Chairs were pleased that the food was delayed until the players began to come in and was served hot. Bill announced that the next tournament will be held March 12, will be a Par 3 Tournament and for the first time, food will be optional.

**<u>4.a HANDICAP COMMITTEE:</u>** Ron stated that the next initiatives of the Handicap committee are to work with the club to have Committee Members and the Club Staff post scores and to have a peer review of scores.

**<u>4.b.</u>** Paul Pecoraro reported that the mix of the multiple tee starts in the last tournament worked well. Dan Mulvey suggested that if a CCGA Tournament permits the posting of a score in the Handicap Computer that instructions for posting a score using mulligan be written on the rules sheet.

**5.a. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE:** Dan Mulvey reported that the Committee was working on several items and would like suggestions of what would be of interest to the members.

**5.b.** Dan introduced Rex Decker as guest speaker. Rex talked about club fittings, shafts, flex and line angle versus bounce. Rex answered questions from the audience.

**<u>6.a. PRO SHOP REPORT:</u>** Mike Hoffstatter stated that there were several outside tournaments scheduled for March. A tournament on March 5 may affect the Dogfight. Other tournaments probably will not affect play.

**<u>6.b.</u>** Mike reported that current maintenance projects consisted of cutting down trees, working on stump removal and improving the greens. Mike stated that the greens had been cut too early while there was still frost in them. The greens have been sliced, top dressed and fertilized and will continue to be top dressed and verticut. The fairways have been fertilized. Mike asked that members avoid wet areas and the yellow areas where weed control had been put down. He requested that ball marks on the greens be fixed.

6.c. Mike answered questions from the audience including:

- 1. Luanne Langmo asked when the greens were expected to be better. Mike responded that if the weather cooperated a big difference should be seen in another week.
- 2. Bill Robinson requested that the CCGA meeting date be placed on the *Sandbagger Calendar*.
- 3. Paul Pecoraro asked if there was anything different taking place during Masters Week. Mike stated that the club has been taking tee times since September and members may fill in on availability.
- 4. Mike announced that new carts will be delivered the beginning of March.

**7.a. OLD BUSINESS:** Ron stated that some members had complained about having to buy the meals at tournaments. Ron sent a letter to the club requesting that meals be optional and also some people wanted a choice. Mike and Hank have agreed to try optional meals for three months beginning in March to see how it works out. Ron cautioned the members that if there are not enough participants eating the lunches that we will go back to including lunch with the tournament. The sign up sheets for the March tournament will have a space to sign up for lunch. Paul Pecoraro recommended that a breakfast buffet be tried instead of lunch especially during the months when we have a late tee time. The Tournament Chairs will explore this with the Club.

**7.b.** Paul Pecoraro, Chair of Match Play League, has made up a schedule and objectives for a Match Play League to start in April. The last Match Play League was open to only seniors but this new one will be open to all CCGA members and will be called "Day Light Golfing" to start and end with day light savings time. There will be an open schedule April - September, pick your own schedule of probably 3 matches a month. The cost will be \$100 with a banquet in October and no cost to CCGA.

**8.a. NEW BUSINESS:** Ron announced that Paul Pecoraro and another member of the Handicap Committee will be attending a USGA Certification Course in handicapping. The club needs to be certified by the USGA in order to be part of the handicapping system.

**<u>8.b.</u>** Mike Hoffstatter announced that the course had been re-rated approximately three weeks ago. He has just received the information but has not had a chance to review it.

9. The next meeting will be Monday, March 21.

10. The meeting was adjourned at 7:35 pm.

President Ron Phillips called the meeting to order at 6:31 pm, welcomed everyone and acknowledged new member Raymond Smith

**<u>1.a PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS:</u>** Ron explained the allocation of the total of \$40 for tournament fees as follows: (Fee is based on not belonging to the cart plan.)

Cart Fee:\$14Meal:\$8Prize Money\$13 (for tournament being played that day)To Treasury:\$5 (to pay for items during the year)

The above fee has also included two free mulligan tickets for each tournament. Ron stated that approximately 40% of the participants receive a prize at each tournament. He also stated that CCGA pays for the hole-in-one trophies and makes up of up to \$100 for a hole-in-one if there is not enough money in the pot. These extras are paid for through the \$5 dues and \$5 from each tournament to the Treasury. CCGA has also been able to sponsor a hole for the Breast Cancer Tournament, pay for free tournaments and contribute toward club projects.

Dan Mulvey asked if CCGA is in financial trouble. Ron explained that the finances were in good shape.

**<u>1.b.</u>** Ron announced that the monitor for the Dogfight Computer had died but the Bahens have donated one so that CCGA does not have to purchase a new monitor!

**2. MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING:** President Ron asked if there were any additions or corrections from the February minutes posted in the Members' Lounge or sent out by e-mail. There being no corrections, he declared the February 21, 2005 Minutes approved as written.

**<u>3. TREASURER'S REPORT</u>**: Earl Bennett reported that the balance as of March 14 was \$1,765.79. Earl stated that a check payable to "Toys for Tots" written in December has not appeared in the bank statements and he will investigate it further. A copy of the report is posted in the Member's Lounge and will be placed with these minutes.

**4. TOURNAMENT CHAIR REPORT:** Co-Chair, Bill Robinson, reported that 80 players participated in the Par Three Tournament held on March 12 with approximately 40% of the participants receiving prizes. Bill announced that the next tournament will be held April 16, will be a Captain's Choice with a 9:00 a.m. shotgun.

**<u>5. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE:</u>** Dan Mulvey introduced guest speaker Rex Decker. Rex talked about Drivers and answered questions from the audience. **6.a HANDICAP COMMITTEE:** Ward Welch announced that the last Dogfight had been audited and 43 members had entered scores. There were a few discrepancies and three non-members who did not post. Scores will continue to be audited. The Committee has been pleased with the improvement of scores being posted. Wayne Jones congratulated the Handicap Committee on their work.

**<u>6.b.</u>** Ward announced that practice rounds may be played and if rounds are not played by the rules, the scores should not be posted. Players are expected to post their scores after play. Ward also mentioned that he has been working with Mike Hoffstatter for a sign-in sheet when playing a round and if a round is not declared a practice round prior to playing, the score is expected to be posted. There also will be a list placed periodically in the Members Lounge of members and their postings for peer review.

**7.a. PRO SHOP REPORT:** Mike announced that new tee markers with advertisers and hole identification have been placed at each hole.

**7.b.** Mike reported that currently maintenance is working on stump removal, that the #6 Black Tee will be an April, May project, and the course is being cleaned up this week with the help of the club members. He explained Masters' Week Pro Shop Policy, stated that new items for spring were arriving in the Pro Shop and reminded members to repair ball marks and fill divots.

7.c. Mike answered questions from the audience including:

- 1. Ward Welch asked why the course rating was lower and Burt Wronsky asked if it wouldn't be better to have the course rated when it is in a more reasonable condition. Mike is looking into the reason for the lower rating but did state that winter conditions were taken into consideration during the rating process. Mike also mentioned that after a course had been rated three times that the next rating usually would take place in ten years. However, he felt that due to all the construction at Cedar Creek, the next rating would take place sooner.
- 2. Dick Griffis asked why the greens were not in better shape. Mike answered that if the weather had been better the greens would be back to normal. The back greens are almost back to normal but the front greens have also had drainage issues. Marty Katz asked if Mike would entertain a two stroke local rule on the greens with severe problems. Ron suggested that the Grounds Superintendent and Mike make that decision before play each day. Mike will consider the suggestion.
- Earl Bennett asked why the #1 Tee was closed. Mike stated that the #1 tee box gets very little sun and is very wet during the winter. Trees have been marked for removal to help the situation.

**8.a. OLD BUSINESS:** Paul Pecoraro, Chair of Match Play League, reported that there are enough people signed up for the League. There will be red, white and black divisions. Members may still sign up. There will be a meeting Thursday March 31 after the Dogfight.

8.b. President Ron announced that he has put together the following committees.

1. Memorial Committee. This Committee will look into alternatives to planting trees to remember CCGA members who are deceased. The Committee will make a report at the July meeting. The members are:

2. On-Course Medical Emergency Committee. This Committee is to determine what, if anything, CCGA and/or the Club can do to improve the response to serious medical emergencies that occur on the Golf Course. The committee will report at the July meeting. The members are:

John Turner, Chair Jay Nuckols Gene Reardon Ann Reinhard

Gene Reardon reported that he is also a member of the Residents Committee for Medical Emergencies and residents will be needed to be trained by the Red Cross to train other residents.

3. Financial Committee with Earl Bennett as Chair will meet after the previous committees have made their reports to decide how to allocate CCGA funds.

**<u>9. NEW BUSINESS:</u>** Paul Pecoraro made a motion to eliminate mulligans from the CCGA golf tournaments. The motion was seconded. After discussion and a recommendation that mulligans be eliminated in tournaments in which a score can be posted, Paul amended his motion as follows:

Paul made a motion to eliminate mulligans in tournaments in which a score can be posted and to leave the decision of giving mulligans, at not cost to participants, up to the Tournament Committee in other tournaments. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

10. The next meeting will be Monday, April 18.

11. The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 pm.

#### CEDAR CREEK GOLF ASSOCIATION MONTHLY MEETING

#### April 18, 2005

- 1. Mike was asked about maintenance in the sand bunkers, some traps are packed in mud with no sand. The traps are inconsistent. Mike responded that some will be spiked and better drainage in areas needs to be addressed before filling the traps with sand. There is no exact plan at this time for sand bunker maintenance.
- 2. Burt Wronsky remarked that there was a septic odor when sitting on the veranda. Mike stated that there is a drain field nearby that is root bound from the trees. At this time there is not a plan to correct the problem.
- 3. George Patterson asked if there was a time table for the new black tee on #6. Mike answered the work had been started but manpower is an issue. It is in the plan to be completed this year but must be done by the end of June to provide sufficient grow-in time prior to cold weather.

d. All players are being asked to please repair ball marks, especially on their finishing hole.

e. There will be no dogfight on 24 May.

f. Mike stated that he has been getting very positive feed back on the condition of the golf course from club members and non members.

There were questions from the Lou Ann Langmo on start times which were in the May Sandbagger and will be in the June Sandbagger.

### **CEDAR CREEK GOLF ASSOCIATION MONTHLY MEETING**

**<u>3.a. MEMORIAL COMMITTEE:</u>** Art Kennedy reported that the Committee had been formed to present options other than planting trees to memorialize deceased CCGA members. The Committee presented three options as follows:

1. Engraved Granite Bricks using the tree on the left in front of the club house with a brick walk around the tree, two benches and a memorial monument. This option would cost approximately \$2000.

2. Also in front of the club house using the flag pole, paved bricks, a walkway, shrubbery and a 4-sided memorial plaque at an approximate cost of \$2300.

3. At the 7th green - on the right as you come up to the green at the cart turn around, plant a "Remembrance Garden" with low maintenance shrubs that would bloom at different times of the year (possibly Azaleas, Lantana, Burning Bush, etc.) and a memorial stone. The grass would be removed and replaced with pine straw. This option would help with erosion. Approximate cost would be \$500 - \$1000.

<u>3.b.</u> There were comments and questions from the members including drainage problems, charging for bricks, needing a standing committee, deal with the memorials as they come and what would happen to the current markers. (The markers would be replaced by markers lower to the ground and would not be taken away). The members thought Option 3 was the most viable.

<u>3.c.</u> Luanne Langmo made a motion to accept Option #3. After discussion, Paul Pecoraro amended the motion to include authorization to spend up to \$1,000 on this project. The motion was seconded and unanimously carried.

<u>3.d</u>. Ron thanked the Committee for their work. He also noted that the Committee will have to come up with options for the wording on the memorial stone and implement the project.

**<u>1. MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING:</u>** President Ron asked if there were any additions or corrections from the August Minutes posted in the Members' Lounge and sent out by e-mail. There being no corrections, he declared the August 15, 2005 Minutes approved as posted.

If there is a large turnout for the November tournament any extra monies (in excess of the \$1100 carried forward to the 2006 board) could be given out as prizes. That decision would be made after the November tournament.

5.b. After questions and discussion, Paul Pecoraro made a motion that the December Tournament meal be paid for by CCGA and the Tournament Directors have the option of paying out additional prize money if we can do so and still carry forward a minimum of \$1100 to 2006. The motion was seconded and passed.

**6.a NEW BUSINESS:** Ron reminded the members that the Dogfight start time would change the first Tuesday after November 1. Therefore, the Dogfight start time will change to 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, November 8. This start time affects only Tuesday and Thursday Dog Fights. The Saturday Dogfight start time will remain 9 a.m.

**<u>6.b.</u>** Paul Pecoraro announced that he has been working on an alternative group to start playing at a later time (11-11:30). This is not a CCGA group. The type of tournament will be determined by the number of players.

**6.c.** Pat Sullivan suggested that the CCGA Board look at increasing dues to \$10 and include flyers to residents who are not members of the Golf Club. Ron reminded the members that the

CCGA Constitution states that dues are \$5.00 and CCGA members must be members of the Golf Club. In order to implement Pat's suggestions, we would have to change the CCGA Constitution and ByLaws. This is a long process.

<u>6.d</u>. Ron brought up "putting out" in the Dogfight Tournaments. He reminded the members that the CCGA ByLaws require that CCGA events be played according to USGA Rules. Dogfight Rules also require we play in accordance with USGA Rules. CCGA has required that putts be holed out in our Monthly Tournaments. But CCGA has been lax in enforcing "putting out" in the Dogfight. This has resulted in "gimees" of varying lengths in the Dogfights, even when they are for points. Ron stated that effective 18 October 2005 CCGA will enforce current CCGA ByLaws and Dogfight Rules and require that all putts in the Dogfight be holed out when they are for points. This will ensure that there is a level playing field for all Dogfight participants.

**6.e.** Burt Wronsky requested that Mike Hoffstatter make the determination each day according to course conditions as to whether or not players may" lift, clean and place" or "roll" the ball.

7. The next meeting will be Monday, November 21.

8. Adjournment at 7:50 pm.
