John also announced that the CCGA and the S/W committee will be having a ribbon cutting ceremony with wine and cheese honoring all those who contributed to the AED Fund. John also announced that the Committee will be sponsoring a fundraising tournament on May 4, 2007. Proceeds from this event will be used to purchase additional AED units in an effort to improve medical emergency readiness on the golf course.

6. PROGRAMS & EVENTS

Chairperson, Bill Steinle presented a tentative 2007 CCGA Special Events Calendar to the members. He and his committee have laid out the plans for a variety of different events throughout the course of the year. A copy is attached to these minutes and posted on the bulletin board. Some of those include events also include Club sponsored events on Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Labor Day. The committee is also working to put together possible inter club match play with Woodside Plantation and Midland Valley among other area clubs.

7. LADIES REPORT

Pat Sullivan reported that the Ladies group had their first board meeting this morning. The ladies want to remind members who question why the Ladies 18 Hole Group is not within the CCGA, that they must be a member of a Ladies Association in order to participate in CSRA Sponsored Women's events. Pat also stated that the Ladies recognize and are looking into issues that have come up playing in front of the Thursday Dogfight. Dan mentioned that he has spoken to Ladies President Monica Randall about a possible "Battle of the Sexes" Tournament. The ladies are considering the possibility.

8. HANDICAP COMMITTEE

Chuck Scarton, chairperson, stated that he and his committee will be working to ensure a fair and level playing field for all members. A committee meeting is planned for the near future.

9. CLUB MANAGEMENT REPORT

Doug Fisher, GM/Dir. Golf, reported that he had been brought on board to make quality changes in the GCCC and to bring it up to a new level. Doug fielded numerous questions and comments from the members. Topics discussed included The Range Plan issue, increases in the membership fees, hiring of new GCCC employees, work on the course i.e. tree removal and bunker restoration, when will #4 green be ready for play, and upgrades to enhance merchandise and food and beverage. Doug stated that a tentative plan is being worked out and any changes regarding membership would be presented in writing to the GCCC members before any action is taken.

Doug also announced the Golf Club at Cedar Creek has obtained a 5 year contract with Par World Junior Golf. GCCC will be one of three courses in the nation to host young people from 32 countries for this junior tournament.

The tournament is to be broadcast on the Golf Channel. This year the Tournament is June 13 to June 16. The club will be looking for volunteers to host, chaperone, and perform a variety of other duties. See Doug at the Club for more information. Doug is also looking into reciprocal privileges with area courses during the four days the course will be tied up.

10. NEW BUSINESS

Dan announced the Marty Katz, creator and in-house expert on the Dogfight Computer programs, has recently finished working on a series of upgrades which will provide new options as it relates to participating in the Dogfight. The Dogfight can now be played in a variety of different formats. Dan will have Jim Mitchell and the Dogfight Committee get together with Marty and report back at the next meeting.

11. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Because Jim Mitchell was not able to be present at this meeting, the November motion made to table the Membership/Associate Membership Fee issue brought up by Jim will be resolved at the February 2007 meeting.

CEDAR CREEK GOLF ASSOCIATION

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1. NAME

The name of this organization shall be Cedar Creek Golf Association of Aiken, South Carolina.

ARTICLE 2. PURPOSE

This organization has been formed to promote fellowship **and welfare** among members of **the Golf Club at Cedar Creek**, and to foster a desire for advancement and improvement of their golf games.

ARTICLE 3. MEMBERSHIP

Membership in this association will be open to all golfers who are members in good standing with the **Golf Club at Cedar Creek**.

ARTICLE 4. OFFICERS

The officers of this association shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Tournament Director.

ARTICLE 5. EXECUTIVE BOARD

Votasion 8/15/02 + accepted.

The Executive Board shall be comprised of the elected officers of the association and the immediate past-president. This board shall transact and carry on the day-to day business of the association, making recommendations to the club members and setting dates for various golfing and social events. It shall keep the association an active organization through regular management of association affairs.

ARTICLE 6. MEETINGS

The Association meetings are to be held monthly at the time set forth by the President and will be open to all members. The Annual Association Meeting is to be held in December. Executive Board meetings will be held at a time and place as set forth by the President.

ARTICLE 7. AMENDMENTS

The Constitution and/or Bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the membership present at the Annual Meeting or a called meeting where a quorum of the lesser of one- fourth or twenty five (25) of the members is present, and provided that a three week posted notice is given.

ARTICLE 8. RULES OF ORDER

Robert's Rules of order shall govern all proceedings of all meetings of the association.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE 1. MEMBERS RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES

Any member with dues paid up to date shall be considered in good standing and shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of the association and participate in all events upon compliance with all adopted regulations.

ARTICLE 2. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The election of officers shall be held annually at the December meeting of the association. New officers take over the first of January of the next year.

Section 2. The President shall appoint a nominating committee consisting of three members of the association to solicit nominations and prepare a ballot consisting of at least one candidate for each elected office sixty days prior to the Annual Meeting. Thirty days prior to the Annual Meeting the above slate will be published **and posted on the Association Bulletin Board.** Nominations may be made from the floor provided the persons nominated have agreed to accept the nomination.

Section 3. Voting shall be by the members present at the December meeting of the Association. Voting must be done by ballot where there is more than one candidate for a position. Process may be changed to a "show of hands" where there is only one candidate for a position.

Section 4. The term of office shall be for one year, beginning January 1 and ending December 31 of the calendar year following the election.

Section 5. In the event of a vacancy on the Executive Board, the President shall appoint, with the concurrence of the Board, a member in good standing to fulfill the remainder of the term. The VicePresident shall serve out the term of the President in the event of the incapacitation, death, or resignation of the President prior to the end of the President's elected term.

ARTICLE 3. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the association and to appoint special committees. The President shall serve as an Ex- officio member of all committees and serve as liasion with the Golf Club at Cedar Creek management.

Section 2. The Vice President shall serve as President in the absence of the President.

Section 3. The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings and take care of all correspondence. The records are to be turned over to the new Secretary at the beginning of a new year.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all funds of the association subject to the approval of the association. Expenditures up to \$200 can be approved by a minimum of two Board members. Expenditures over \$200 must be approved by the association at a scheduled monthly meeting of the association. The Treasurer shall be required to present a written report of the financial status at each monthly association meeting and to present a written financial report in December showing all receipts and expenditures during the Treasurer's term in office.

Section 5. The Tournament Director shall be responsible for planning and conducting all scheduled Cedar Creek Golf Association tournament competitions. The Director shall prepare and coordinate a schedule of events that will be distributed to the members of the association.

ARTICLE 4. DUES

The amount of the yearly dues for each member of the association shall be reviewed by the Executive Board each year. The Executive Board shall recommend in November any changes considered necessary to the dues and any such changes must then be approved by a two-thirds vote of the members present at the December annual meeting. The changed dues will then become effective the following calendar year.

ARTICLE 5. TOURNAMENT RULES

Section 1. The association will play golf according to the USGA Rules and such local rules as are published for the course being played.

Section 2. Score cards must be signed, dated and attested and turned in to the scorekeeper after each tournament or members will not be elligible for prizes.



Rules of Golf: Info and quiz. CCGA Meeting February 20, 2007

FIRE ANT MOUNDS: An ant hill is considered to be/loose impediment and not that of a burrowing animal. Relief is not allowed but the player is entitled to remove an ant hill under Rule 23-1 and Decision 23/5. In the case of fire ants the USGA recommends a local rule giving relief from fire-ant mounds if the ball is so close to the mound that the player is in danger of being stung by fire-ants.

If a local rule has not been adopted and a ball is so close to a fire-ant mound that the player is in danger, the player is, in equity, entitled to relief. That is without penalty dropping a ball on the nearest spot not nearer the hole which is not dangerous. If in a hazard it must be dropped in the same hazard or if not in a similar nearby hazard but in either case not nearer the hole.

If it is not possible for the player to drop the ball in a hazard, he may drop it, under penalty of one stroke, outside the hazard. Decision 1-4/10.

POISON OAK:

If a player's ball comes to rest in or near an area of plants such as poison ivy/oak should the provisions of the decision regarding "dangerous Situtations" apply?

No. The player must either play the ball as it lies or if applicable proceed under Rule 26 (Water Hazards) or Rule 28 (Ball Unplayable). Decision 1-4/10 contemplates a situation which is unrelated to conditions normally encountered on the course. Unpleasant lies are a common occurrence which players must accept: Decision 1-4/11.



Local Rules

Out of Bounds

The boundary of the course is defined by square white posts. In the absence of these posts, the boundary is defined by residential property markers (round white posts): all residential properties, whether developed/occupied or not, are out of bounds.

Abnormal Ground Conditions / Ground Under Repair

In addition to any area of the course specifically marked as Ground Under Repair, the following conditions will be considered Abnormal Ground Conditions. Through the green, a player whose ball lies in, or whose stance or intended swing area is interfered by, any of these conditions may take relief without penalty, within one club length of the nearest point of relief, not nearer the hole (Rule 25-1). Penalty for breach of local rule: Match play – Loss of hole; Stroke play – 2 strokes.

- Earth/grass covered drainage ditches (french drains), i.e. those with rocks or stones in or beneath the grass that could cause damage to a club,
- Artificial water diversion ditches marked by white painted lines,
- The Memorial Garden area to the right of the 7th green.

Rules for the day will be determined and posted by the Director of Golf dependent upon the weather and course conditions.

 On any hole(s) designated by the Director of Golf as 'Cart Path Only', a ball on any closely mown area through the green may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and placed within one club-length of the spot where it lay, not nearer the hole. Penalty for breach of local rule: Match play – Loss of hole; Stroke play – 2 strokes.

Immovable Obstructions

Interference by an immovable obstruction (Rule 24-2) occurs when a ball lies in or on an obstruction, or when the obstruction interferes with a player's stance or the area of his intended swing. Intervention on the line of play is not, of itself, interference under this Rule. A player may take relief without penalty, within one club length of the nearest point of relief, not nearer the hole. Immovable obstructions include, but are not necessarily limited to, the following:

- Electrical junction/control boxes anywhere on the course,
- Protective raised ropes (green and white ropes on green posts) anywhere on the course,
- Water dispensers and trash receptacles,
- Sprinkler heads and drainage gratings anywhere on the course.

Yellow cart ropes placed across some fairways, and white 150-yard marker posts, are movable obstructions.

Distance-Measuring Devices

For all play at this course, a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, if, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g., gradient, wind-speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

CEDAR CREEK GOLF ASSOCIATION MONTHLY MEETING MINUTES

APRIL 17, 2007

Dan Mulvey called the meeting to order and welcomed all those present. He reminded members to sign in and update e-mail addresses. Thirty four members were present. Dan then shared an amusing golf joke.

There have been no holes-in-one or other stupendous feats on the course to date.

1. MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING

There being no corrections or additions to the March 20, 2007 Minutes, Dan declared them accepted as posted.



MATCH PLAY:

Rule 2-4: Concession of Next Stroke, Hole or Match:

Rule 2-5: Doubt as to procedure: Disputes or Claims:

In Match Play if a dispute arises between the players a player may make a claim. The claim must be made before teeing off on the next hole or if on the last hole before leaving the putting green. "My recommendation is that if a resolution can't be agreed to by the players then a call should be made to the pro shop from the course to try and locate Doug Fisher for resolution." However Rule 34-1 does allow the match to continue if a claim is lodged but a decision should be made by the committee as soon as possible so that the state of the match may, if necessary be adjusted.

(In stroke play the player can play two balls but must declare which he wants to be counted.)

If the players agree to halve the hole, for example, and do so without agreeing to waive a rule then the hole is considered to be halved.

Players can agree to halve a hole if both have made at least one stroke in the playing of the hole but the hole is not complete. Example, both players have lost balls on their second stroke.

Rule 7 Practice:

Unless prohibited by the committee a player may practice on the competition course before a match play round.

7-2 DURING THE ROUND:

A player must not make a practice stroke during the play of a hole. Between the play of two holes, a player must not make a practice stroke except that he may practice putting or chipping on or near: 1) the putting green of the hole last played, 2) any practice putting green, or 3) the teeing ground of the next hole to be played in the round, provided a practice stroke is not made from a hazard and DOES NOT UNDULY DELAY PLAY.

Let's assume the hole is conceded on the teeing ground. Strokes made in continuing the play of a hole, the result of which has been decided, are not practice strokes and are allowed without penalty.

Rule 9 - Information as to strokes taken:

9-2: An opponent is entitled to ascertain from the player, during the play of the hole, the number of strokes taken and after play of the hole, the number of strokes taken on the hole just completed. IFA PLAYER GIVES WRONG INFORMATION, HE LOSES THE HOLE. A player has given wrong information even if it is due to the failure to include a penalty that he did not know he had incurred. IT IS THE PLAYERS RESPONSIBILITY TO KNOW THE RULES.

Rule 22 Ball assisting or Interfering with Play

Except when a ball is in motion, if a player considers that the ball of another player might interfere with his play, he may have it lifted. In stroke play, a player required to lift his ball may play first rather than lift the ball. Rule 4. Clubs

Penalty for breach of Rule 4-4 Maximum of 14 clubs

- a. Match Play at the conclusion of the hole at which the breach is discovered, the state of the match is adjusted by deducting one hole for each hole at which a breach occurred. Maximum Deduction per round: Two Holes.
- b. Stroke Play Two strokes for each hole at which any breach occurred: Maximum penalty per Round: Four Strokes.

Disqualification is the penalty for carrying but not using a non- conforming club-Decision 4-1/1.

May 15, 2007

Dan Mulvey called the meeting to order and welcomed all those present. He reminded members to sign in and update e-mail addresses. Twenty nine members were present for the outdoor meeting. Dan then shared an amusing alligator related Golf story.

1. MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING

There being no corrections or additions to the April 17, 2007 Minutes, Dan declared them accepted as posted.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT - Andrew Wilson

Andrew Wilson reported the balance in the treasury at \$4,011.75 of which a portion is due to Match Play funds. Andrew explained the expenses and revenue through May 15, 2007. Andrews report was accepted as presented. A copy will be posted on the bulletin board.

3. TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE - Greg Pasco

Greg Pasco announced that the next Tournament will be held on May 19, 2007. It will be a computer generated Captains Choice with a shot gun start at 8 AM followed by lunch. Sign up is available in the pro shop.

4. HANDICAP/RULES COMMITTEE - George Montgomery

George Montgomery was unable to present his demonstration on rules for ground under repair due to lack of available space.

Ron Phillips brought up a question regard the posting of scores by groups who "roll the ball" in events not sponsored by the CGGA and still post a score for that round. Chuck Scarton reminded those present that by doing so, they are not in accordance with the rules of the USGA which states that unless otherwise specified by a local ruling, the ball must be played down. When asked if an audit had been done, Chuck replied that two audits had taken place this year and individuals have been spoken to regarding infractions.

5. WELFARE & SAFETY - John Turner

John Turner announced that the Jerry Sullivan Memorial Tournament held on May 4, 2007 was an unprecedented success. John reported that the committee had exceeded its goal of being able to procure two additional AED units for the course. The committee has the funds to purchase all the AED units that were set forth in the Safety Committees' plan. John thanked everyone who helped make this project such a success.

John stated that the committee will be meeting to begin the process of purchasing, mapping out placement, deploying and securing the units.

6. PROGRAMS & EVENTS - Bill Steinle

Dan reported for Bill Steinle. The Match Play tourney continues. Those participating were reminded that the reception is scheduled for June 2, 2007 from 4 to 6:30 PM. Participants are invited to bring a guest to the reception. The cost is \$12.50 per person and guests must be signed up by May 29, 2007.

The Woodside Home/Home tournaments are scheduled for July and August. The sign-ups are available in the Proshop.

Steve Santos reported that the Carolinas Inter Club Match Play is set to begin on May 20, 2007. The new Cedar Creek team shirts are in and are being distributed.

8. NEW BUSINESS

Dan brought up the item from the Executive Board posed at the April meeting regarding the CCGA Fiscal Year. The Executive Board feels that a fiscal year change to October 1st thru September 30th instead of the calendar

year would enable collection of Association dues to coincide the annual club dues. The Association dues can be collected automatically and continue for new members throughout the year. This change would also coincide with the election of the Executive Board. Because this matter would require a change to the Association's constitution, Dan asked those present to express their interest in pursuing this matter by raising their hands. The majority of the group expressed interest in pursuing this matter. Dan stated that the Board will pursue this matter and prepare the necessary documentation to present to the Association.

Mimi Wittkamp thanked all those who contributed to the 'Julie Gant Fund." Julie was extremely grateful and moved by the caring and generosity of all those who wished her well.

Mimi also reported that the Ladies 18 Hole Group will once again be participating in the Aiken Hook-A-Kid-On-Golf. At every club I've known a course that has members is first for the members the idea being that members and member events support and profit a club. I wonder if we are losing sight of that premise at Cedar Creek.

In some instances the starting times for Cedar Creek regular member events – Catfight, Dogfight, Wednesday Men, etc. – have been adjusted to accommodate tournaments or outings as, for example, the starting time for the May CCGA tournament was moved to 8 a.m. in order for the club to host an afternoon event. In what seems to be an increasing number of instances non-member tournaments, events and outings pre-empt regularly scheduled member events altogether.

Some alterations to member activities may be acceptable such as moving forward the starting time of a member activity by an hour as was done for the May CCGA tournament to allow for an afternoon event. For Thursday, May 24th, the Catfight/Dogfight was rescheduled to 2 p.m. to accommodate a morning tournament. In my opinion, that is backwards. What is now the morning non-member event on that day should have been scheduled at 2 p.m. I suspect there will be few who participate in the Catfight/Dogfight that day.

Taking member activities off the calendar altogether with any frequency is unacceptable. Non-member activities should be scheduled with the least disruption to regularly scheduled member activities.

The youth tournament scheduled for June takes member activities off the calendar for an entire week. We were told that we would have reciprocal playing privileges at another area club. We have heard nothing further.

1. MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING

investigated due to the scheduled aerification program on July 9. Due to the special needs of a Par 3 Tournament this date may be determined to be the best available date. Sign up is available in the Pro Shop. Dan also stated that year- to-date CCGA Tournament prize monies given out are approximately \$5000.

<u>4. HANDICAP/RULES COMMITTEE – Chuck Scarton/George</u> Montgomery

Chuck Scarton reported for the Handicap Committee. After participating in the meeting with the Executive Board and the Thurmonds, Chuck was able to report that the issues regarding *Ground Under Repair* and *Out of Bounds* areas will be addressed by October 1st. The plan is before the Executive Board and will then be presented to the Club ownership. Once the plan is approved by all parties, the purchase of the AEDs and storage units will take place. John estimates that implementation should take four weeks from the time of approval.

Members were reminded that the club does have an AED in the Ambassadors (Ranger) Cart. If members fail to see the unit in the cart, it should be reported to the Pro Shop. CPR/AED training of the Golf Course staff is continuing as schedules permit.

6. PROGRAMS & EVENTS - Bill Steinle/Jim Mitchell

Jim reported that 42 players participated in the Intra Club Match Play Tournament. Mike Wittkamp was the over-all winner, with Abbey Pingitore 2nd and Jackie Huey 3rd. In the Consolation Brackett (new this year) were 1st-Glen Huey, 2nd- Mimi Wittkamp, 3rd- Dan Mulvey and 4th- Andrew Wilson.

Bill reminded members that the Woodside Home/Home tournaments are scheduled for July and August. Watch for individual sign- up applications that will soon be available in the Proshop.

Steve Santos reported that the next Carolinas Inter Club Match Play will be held July 15 vs. Indian Hills GC and July 21 vs. Hidden Valley GC. Both matches are away. The next home match will be August 5.

7. <u>CLUB REPORT</u> - Mike D.

Dan provided follow-up to the membership present regarding the feedback the Board received after the May 15th meeting. The Executive Board received four feed back memos in addition to Dean Woods letter regarding the conditions here at the Club from Association members. Subsequently, a letter was sent to the Thurmonds requesting a meeting with the Executive Board. The Board met with them on June 18, 2007. We provided input to the Thurmonds incorporating member's feedback. Some of the items covered in the meeting included event scheduling, communications, Food & Beverage Service, Pro Shop and course conditions. Ground under repair is defined as an abnormal Ground Condition and interference occurs when a ball lies in or touches the condition or when the condition interfers with the players stance or the area of his intended swing. A ball can be played from ground under repair unless there is a local rule prohibiting play from such areas. The ball may be cleaned and lifted when taking relief. Relief must be carefully determined and relief might mean that the player would have to drop in an area where the ball is then unplayable. For that reason players should not pick up their ball until they are certain of their next step. Once picked up the ball can be replaced but with a penalty stroke. For further information see Rule 25. Abnormal Ground Conditions, Embedded Ball and Wrong Putting Green.

Subsequent to the re-measuring of the course in June by the SCGA, the GC@CC and the Handicap Committee, it was determined that a number of changes to the course set up were necessary and will take effect 09/01/07. The committee is still awaiting comments and opinions from the USGA regarding our course conditions. A copy of the Tee and Yardage Changes are attached to these minutes and will be posted on the bulleting board.

Andrew Wilson presented visuals of the new course score card that will be displayed permanently. The new score card will reflect corrected yardage, slope and rating. The new card will also provide bullets of local rules, AED placements and restroom locations. The new score cards should be available in September.

The Handicap committee then fielded questions from the members that included:

Bill Steinle questioned who, why and when it was decided to change the white tee locations without bringing the issue to the membership.

A. The issue of re-measuring and re-rating the course has been part of the Handicap Committee since January and updates have been presented to the membership at several of the monthly meetings. This is part of the recertification process of our course by the SCGA (and USGA).

Burt Wronsky challenged the right of the committee to re-rate the course without first documenting 100 actual scores.

A. The committee acknowledged that the mathematical method was not used. Since there is no past history of black tee players on the affected tee boxes, there is no data to base a mathematical evaluation. Instead, the best judgment of the Handicap Committee was used. This is not only allowed, but recommended under the rules of golf (Section 17-1 of The USGA Handicap System). The committee will do the mathematical calculations on the recommended 200 hole-by-hole scores after the new score card goes into effect.

Marty Katz questioned an illegal OB stake on # 12 and suggested a local rule change regarding markers.

A. The committee is looking into the marker on #12 and will report back on how they will handle the issue.

George Montgomery provided an interesting demonstration and discussion regarding the rules for *Lateral Hazards*. A brief synopsis of the rules and options are attached to the minutes posted on the bulletin board.

5. WELFARE & SAFETY - John Turner

Chuck reported for John on the status of the AED implementation project. Hank Thurmond OK'd the plan and the six AEDs have been ordered and received. We are awaiting materials for the AED stands and boxes. Once received, the implementation committee will begin construction. Our goal is for complete deployment by September.

6. PROGRAMS & EVENTS - Bill Steinle

Bill reported that the Woodside Home/Home event will take place here on August 1st and at Woodside Plantation on August 15th. There are still white tee player slots available.

7. CLUB REPORT - Mike D.

Mike thanked Chuck and the Handicap committee for the tremendous job they are doing in correcting and identifying the course. 

Tee and Yardage Changes

Subsequent to the re-measuring of the course in June 2007 by representatives of the South Carolina Golf Association, the Club, working with the SCGA and the Handicap Committee, has determined that a number of changes to the course set-up will be implemented with effect from September 1, 2007. The changes include the following:

- Relocating the Gold tee to the Blue tee box on Hole 15,
- Relocating the Blue tee to the Gold tee box on Hole 5,
- Relocating the White tee to the Blue tee box on Holes 2, 5, 8 and 14,
- Relocating the Black tee to the White tee box on Holes 2, 12 and 14,
- Adjusting the handicap strokes for the Black tees,
- Locating or relocating permanent tee markers on all Holes,
- Correcting the location of some 150-yard markers.

The changes are being implemented for the following reasons:

- > To bring the yardages on the card into line with the actual distances,
- To allow a better balance of play and wear across all tees,
- To maintain the integrity of the handicap system,
- To comply with the SCGA's recommendations,
- > To adjust the relative difficulty of the course between tees.

The table below shows the changes to overall yardages, ratings and slopes.

The Course Ratings and Slopes have been re-certified by the SCGA and the WSCGA in accordance with USGA procedures, and new handicap tables have been issued (except for the Gold tee, which remains unchanged) and will be posted.

A new scorecard is being prepared, and will be introduced concurrently with the changes to the course. The appropriate changes to the course ratings and slopes will be made in the handicap system computer at the same time.



Rule 26: Water hazards including Lateral Water Hazards.

DEFINITIONS:

Hazard – A hazard is any bunker or water hazard.

Water Hazard – A water hazard is any sea, lake, pond, river, ditch, surface drainage ditch or other open water course (whether or not containing water) and anything of a similar nature on the course. Stakes and lines used to define a water hazard must be yellow.

Lateral Water Hazard – A lateral water hazard is a water hazard or that part of a water hazard so situated that it is not possible or is deemed by the Committee to be impracticable to drop a ball behind the water hazard in accordance with Rule 26-1b. Stakes or lines used to define a lateral water hazard must be red. NOTE: The committee may define a lateral water hazard as a water hazard.

NOTE: Except as provided in the Rules, before making a stroke at a ball that is in a hazard (whether a bunker or water hazard), the player must not:

- a. Test the condition of the hazard or any similar hazard.
- b. Touch the ground in the hazard or water in the water hazard with his hand or a club or
- c. Touch or move a loose impediment lying in or touching the hazard.

There are a few exceptions such as the result from falling or preventing a fall, removing an obstruction, in measuring or in retrieving, lifting, placing or replacing a ball under any rule or (b) places his clubs in a hazard.

You have addressed a ball in a hazard when you have taken your stance.

PROCEDURE:

In order to treat the ball as lost in the hazard, there must be reasonable evidence that the ball lodged in it. In the absence of such evidence, the ball must be treated as a lost ball and Rule 27 applies.

WATER HAZARD defined by yellow stakes: If a ball is in or is lost in a water hazard the player may under penalty of one stroke:

- Play a ball as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played (see Rule20-5); or
- b. Drop a ball behind the water hazard, keeping the point at which the original ball last crossed the margin of the water hazard directly between the hole and the spot on which the ball is dropped, with no limit to how far behind the water hazard the ball may be dropped.

LATERAL WATER HAZARD:


- Play a ball as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played.
- b. Drop a ball anywhere on the far side of the hazard keeping the point where the ball last crossed the hazard and in line with the flagstick.
- c. Drop a ball outside the water hazard within two club-lengths of and not nearer the hole than (1) the point where the original ball last crossed the margin of the hazard or (2) a point on the opposite margin of the water hazard equidistant from the hole. NOTE: The Lateral Water hazard may not have a point on the opposite margin as this could be out of bounds, physically inaccessible, etc.

NOTE: The ball may be lifted and cleaned when proceeding under this rule NOTE: You also have the option of playing the ball as it lies if that is physically possible.

NOTE: Some water hazards are so large or are shaped such that it is impossible to drop behind the water hazard. In such cases the establishment of a Ball drop as an additional option under the water hazard Rule (Rule 26-1) may be justified. NOTE: Line of flight does no apply anywhere in the Rules of Golf.

NOTE: THERE IS NO PROVISION IN THE RULES FOR HITTING A PROVISIONAL BALL If ONE IS NOT SURE IF THE BALL IS IN OR OUT OF THE HAZARD. A local rule can be implemented for use of a provisional ball for water hazards (yellow stakes) if going to inspect the result would result in a delay in play. The ball is played provisionally under any of the available options under Rule 26-1 or any applicable Local Rule. In such a case, if a provisional ball is played and the original ball is in a water hazard, the player may play the original ball as it lies or continue with the provisional ball in play but he may not proceed under Rule 26-1 with regard to the original ball. If the original ball is found outside of the water hazard then the provisional ball is abandoned and the original ball is in play.

LATERAL WATER HAZARD RELIEF PROCEDURES.



26-1/15 Procedures for Relief from Lateral Water Hazard

In the above illustration, a player has played a ball from the teeing ground (Point A) into the lateral water hazard at Point B. It last crossed the margin of the hazard at Point C. He may play the ball as it lies or, under penalty of one Stroke:

- a) play another ball from the teeing ground Rule 26-1a;
- b) drop a ball anywhere on the far side of the hazard on the dotted line from the hole through Point C, e.g., Point D – Rule 26-1b;
- c) drop a ball in the shaded area on the near side of the hazard which is all ground within two club-lengths of Point C, but not nearer the hole than Point C – Rule 26-1c(i) or;
- d) drop a ball in the shaded area on the far side of the hazard which is all ground within two club-lengths of Point E, but not nearer the hole than Point E – Rule 26-1c(ii).

The player MAY NOT drop a ball on the so-called "line of flight" at Point F or anywhere else on the line the ball followed from A to B, except in the shaded area on the near side. Nor may he drop a ball within two club-lengths of Point G, the point on the far side of the hazard directly opposite Point C. A provisional ball is not allowed in this situation.

Water Hazard example:

In the above illustration a player has played a ball from Point A into the "water hazard" at Point B. It last crossed the margin of the hazard at Point C. He may play the ball as it lies or, under penalty of one Stroke:

Water Hozand Yellow states (Y) and or a painted yollow line.

C

- a) Play another ball from Point A.
- b) Drop a ball anywhere on the near side of the hazard on the dotted line from the hole through Point C, e.g., Point D.

He may not play a ball along the line of flight from A to B except at Point C. He may not play a provisional ball in this situation unless one is offered through a local rule.

2. CLUB MANAGEMENT REPORT

Hank thanked the CCGA for the hard work and fine job it's done on this year's tournaments, the AED Program and the Handicap/Course Layout Project. Hank informed the members that Club accountant, Floyd Oliver, was moving to Florida and would be replaced by Cassandra Mitchell. He thanked Mike D. for the fine job he has been doing while they continue to look for a new General Manager. Hank stated that the Club is in the final stages of bringing a new GM on board. In recapping what was accomplished in 2007, Hank noted that 400 trees were removed to enhance grass growth, they stepped up aerification and fairway aerification was done for the first time. 

FAQ for play of water and lateral water hazards on Cedar Creek Golf Club Hole #3.


(FAQ in this case refers only to the area in and around the Pond between the 100 yard marker and up to and near the green).


- 1) Can a body of water be a water hazard and a lateral water hazard?
 - a. A given part of a water hazard can be defined as both a water hazard and a lateral water hazard if conditions warrant. Also a given part of a body of water may be defined as a water hazard and another part of the same body of water as a lateral water hazard (Decision 33-2a/6 and 33-2a/7.
- 2) How may the committee define a body of water where it is impracticable to define the opposite margin?
 - a. The committee may define a body of water as a water hazard or lateral water hazard even though it may not be on the club property. When it is impracticable for the committee to define the opposite margin, the Committee may state that when marked on just one side, a water hazard is deemed to extend to infinity. Accordingly all ground and water beyond the defined margin of the hazard is in the hazard. (Decision 33-2a/11)
- 3) The design of a hole is such that a player must hit the ball about 100 yards in order to carry a water hazard. Should a Ball Drop (Dropping Zone) be located so that it is across the hazard?
 - a. No. The drop zone would allow the player to drop a ball on a part of the course (on the green side of the water hazard) that Rule 26-1b would not have permitted him to reach. (Decision 33-8/2) (My interpretation is that a drop zone on hole #3 would have to be placed somewhere along the fairway between the pond and the cart path although it could be closer than 100 yards.)

HOLE-IN-ONE CLUB

The Golf Club at Cedar Creek manages the Hole-In-One (HIO) Club. Their rules include:

- The HIO Club is open to all members of the Golf Club at Cedar Creek who are in good standing with active memberships.
- 2) The Fund for the HIO Club is maintained by the Club and is paid out for witnessed holes-in-one. The amount paid out is dependant on how much money is in the fund at the time of the HIO. If two or more holes-in-one occur on the same day, claims will be addresses in sequence, based on the time of day the HIO occurred.
- 3) Hole-in-one claims must be made to the golf club pro shop immediately following the round. Information provided must include the name of the player, the hole number, the club used, the tee from which the shot was played, the time of day and the name(s) of the witness(es).
- 4) To enter for a chance to win any accumulated money in the HIO Club Fund, the entrant must contribute fifty cents (\$.50) to the HIO Club prior to playing their round. Playing multiple rounds in the same day requires multiple contributions of fifty cents to the HIO Club Fund.
- A minimum of nine holes must be played to qualify for a payout for a hole-in-one.
- 6) If less than \$500 is in the HIO Fund, one (1) witness other than The player is required. If more than \$500 is in the HIO Fund, the event must be witness by two (2) persons other than the player making the hole-in-one. Hole-in-one claims made by solo players will not be recognized.
- The Hole-In-One Club is intended for holes-in-one made at The Golf Club at Cedar Creek. Claims of a HIO made at other clubs will not be recognized.



Q. In a match, the player's ball-marker on the putting green is pressed down by the opponent. Is the opponent in breach of the Rules?

A. No. Rule 18-3b does not apply to ball-markers. However, if the ball-marker were moved such that it no longer accurately marked the position of the ball, in equity (Rule 1-4), the opponent would incur a penalty of one stroke. If the opponent pressed down the ball-marker with the authority of the player and that act caused it to move, there would be no penalty to either player (see Decision 20-1/6). (New)
