Lesson From Kenny – "Chipping from a tight lie"

- Ball near the green
- Resting on a tight lie
- No trouble between your ball and the intended target

Try using your 8 iron – backswing to the inside, hit easy with a full release.

For a shot not requiring a "lofty" trajectory, try using a hybrid or fairway wood. It puts over-spin on the ball and will roll up to the target similar to a putt.

If your shot requires a "lofty" trajectory, use your sand-wedge. Swing easy with a full release.

Practice these kinds of shots and see what works for you.

Frank sees improvement in the condition of the front nine and people are doing a better job as far as keeping on the cart paths, etc.

When there are puddles on the cart paths, do not navigate around them – drive slowly through them.

The back nine renovation is on schedule.

Tip From the Pro (Kenny E.)

For a 20 or 30 yard shot from the fairway to the green, use your wedge, but make sure to release the club – don't try to hold the face open, just let your arms and wrists roll over.

Dick Leach (Club design & terminology)

A less lofted driver doesn't necessarily mean more distance. A higher ball flight allows the ball to stay in the air longer and may result in a longer drive. Where you hit the ball on the driver clubface determines the actual loft of the shot (due to 'bulge' and 'roll'. Use impact labels or Dr. Scholl powder to determine where on the clubface you are hitting the ball.

Hole #5. Relief from where the Ball lies, not where the obstruction lies.

Tips From Our Pro (Kenny)

There are three rotations in a golf swing: Hips, shoulders and clubface. Through *rhythm* you can maximize distance by effectively using these three rotations. It is important that you not 'hang back' on your right side for a weak follow through – instead, make sure your weight shifts to your left side as you extend and rotate during your swing and follow through.

News From the Course

The back nine renovation is ahead of schedule. Greens have been reshaped, fairways prepared for new grass. Sprigging of greens and fairways will begin at the end of June. Dean Wood will coordinate volunteers for sprigging.

Front Nine: People are doing a better job of repairing Divots and Ballmarks – Keep it up!

Rules of Golf.

Andrew Wilson reviewed and explained our booklet of 'Local Rules'. Local Rules cannot waive or conflict with any existing rule of Golf. They are intended to address and clarify conditions and situations that exist at our golf course. For example: Out of Bounds markers, water hazards, etc.

Tip from the Pro (Kenny Everson)

As the weather heats up the greens dry out and become 'crusty'. Approach shots to the green become a little more 'touchy'. A rule of thumb: If you are trying to reach:

Front of the green– use a 600 wedgeMiddle– use a sand wedgeBack– use a wedge

Accelerate through the shot with 'soft hands' – dead right hand – allow the club to release. The trajectory will be lofted and the ball will land softly.

Treasurer's Report

News From the Course (Dean Wood)

We're done sprigging, the new greens are growing in. Gary and crew are concentrating on the back nine reconstruction, as such, the front nine will get more attention when they are more along with the back (Irrigation fixes, etc.)
